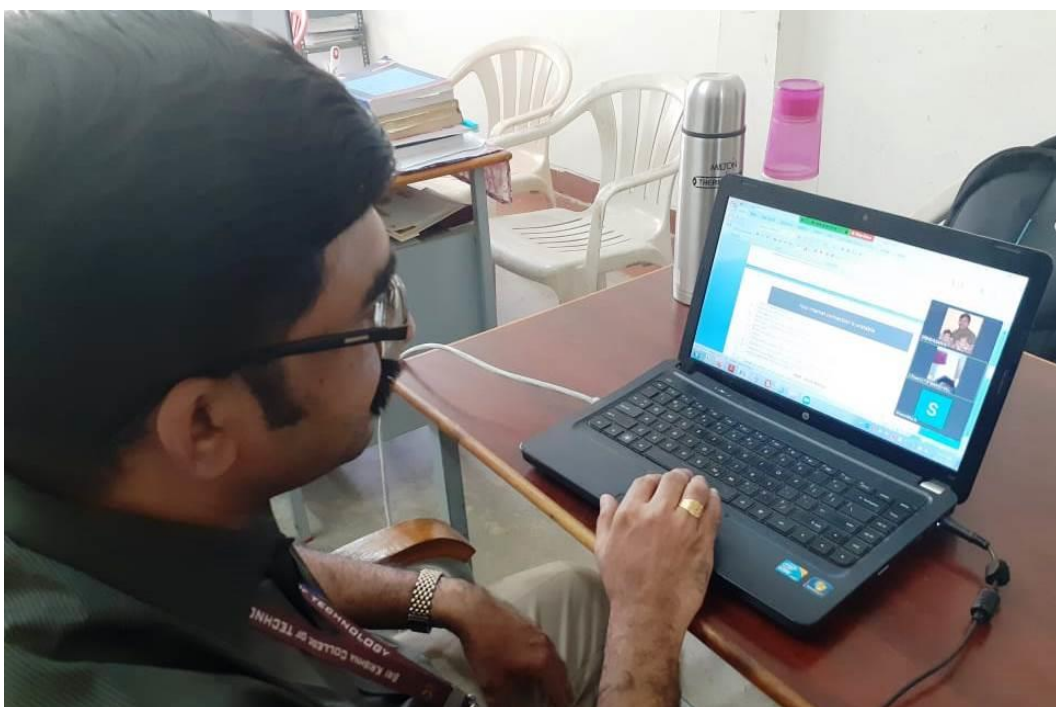
STUDENTS' ACHIEVEMENTS

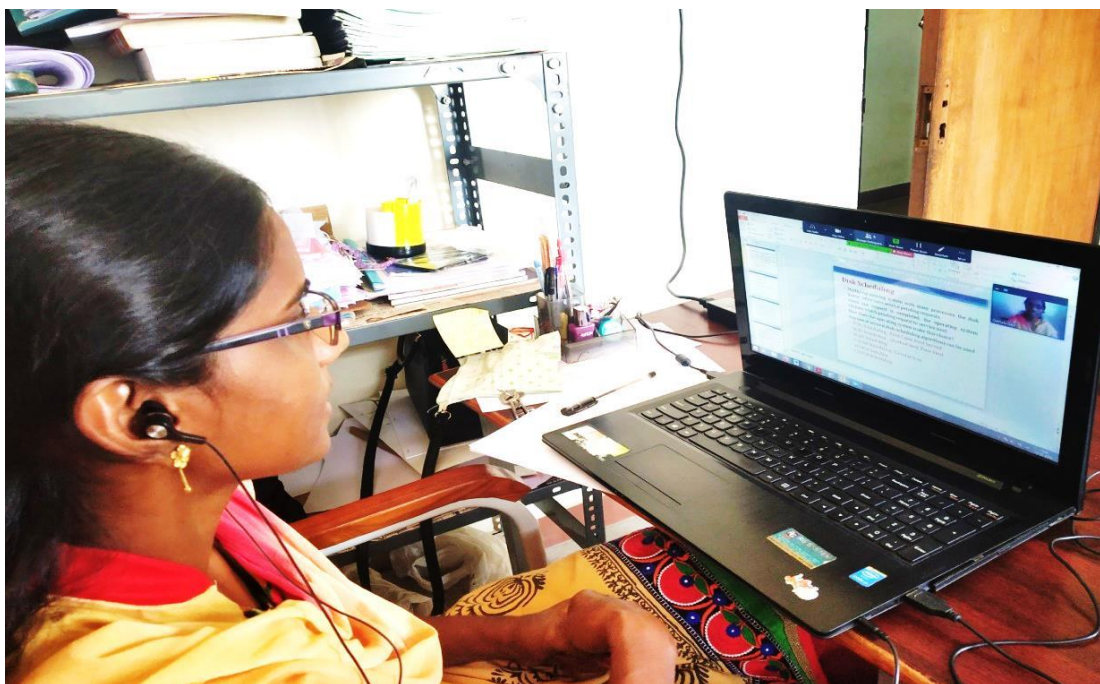

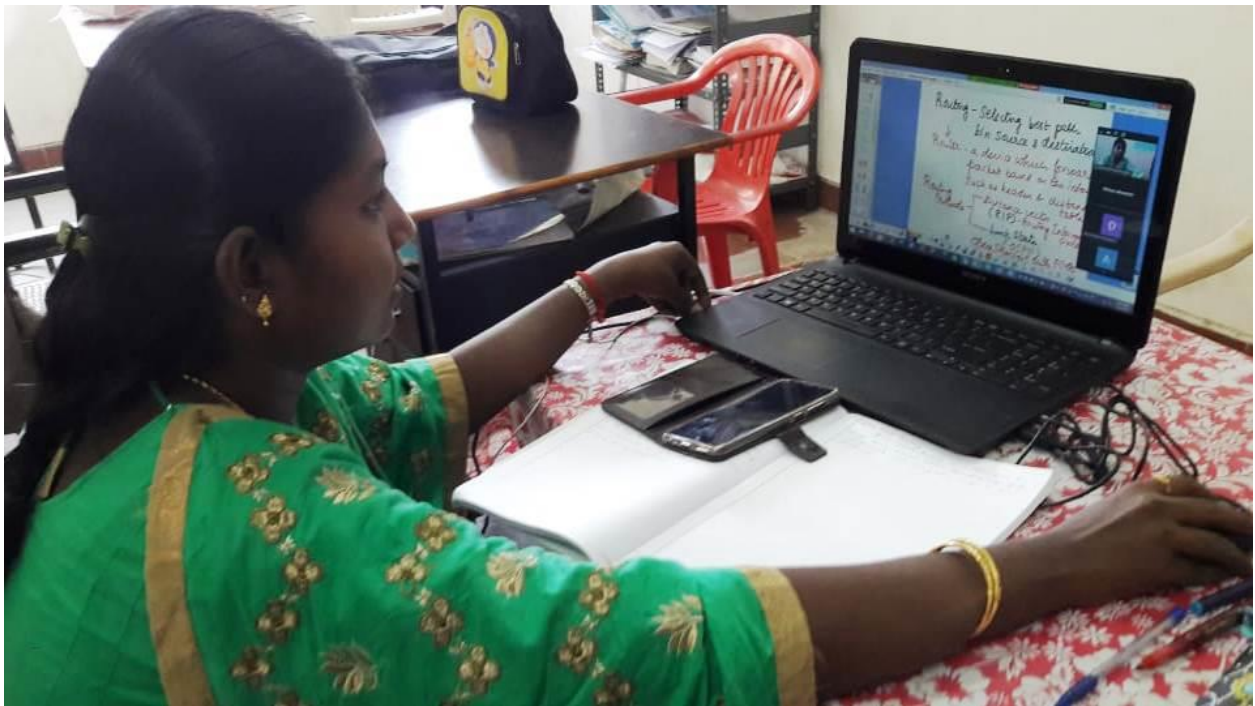

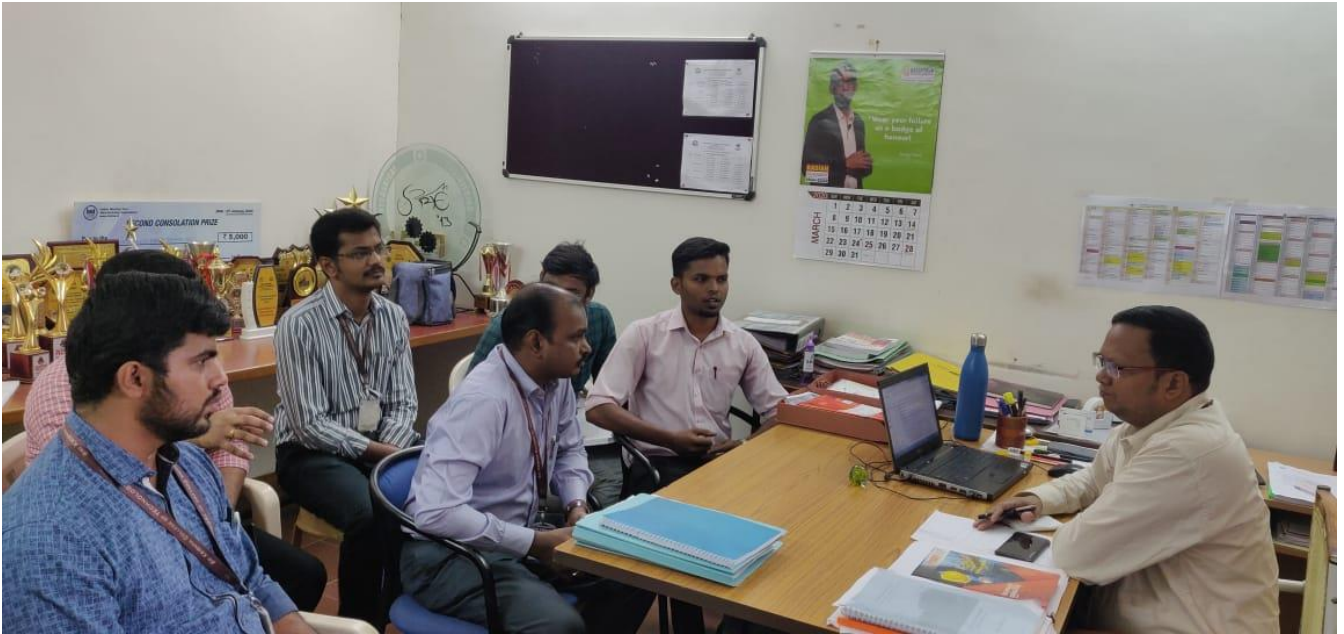
MEETINGS & DISCUSSIONS

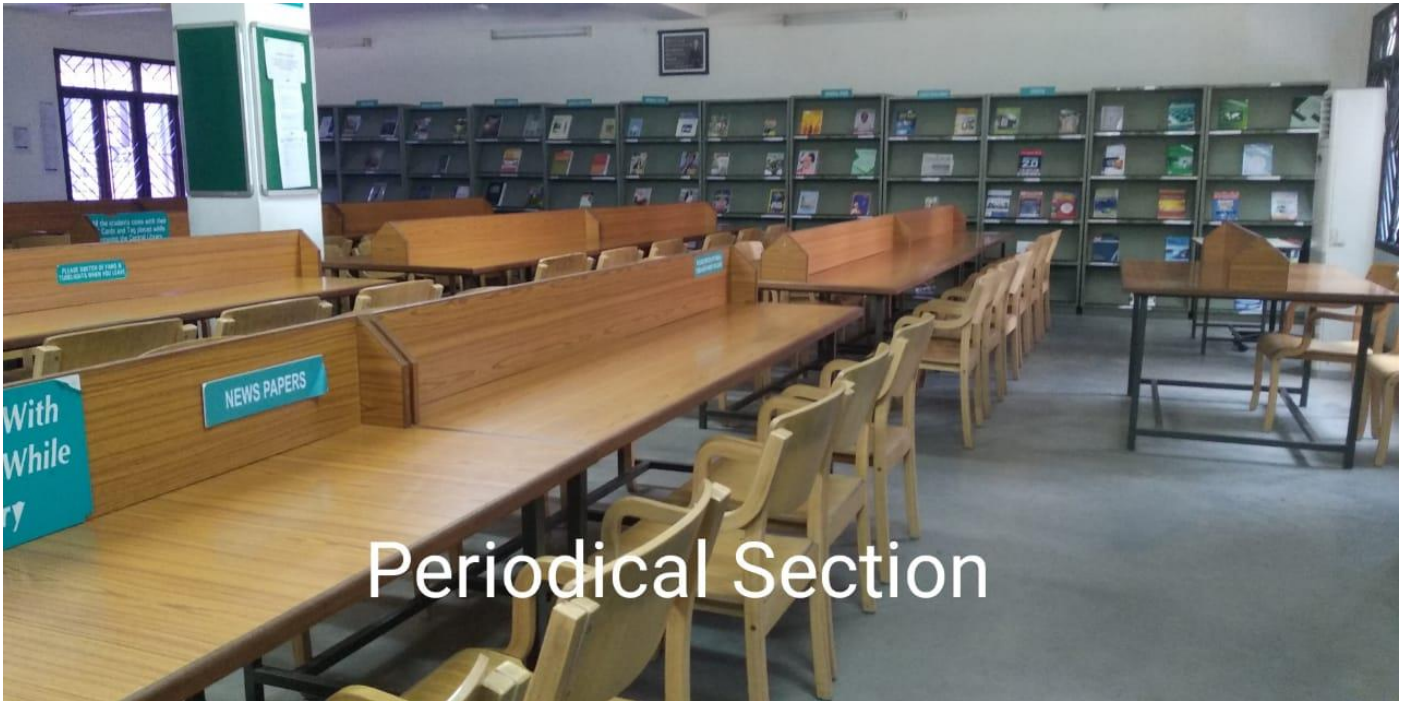
