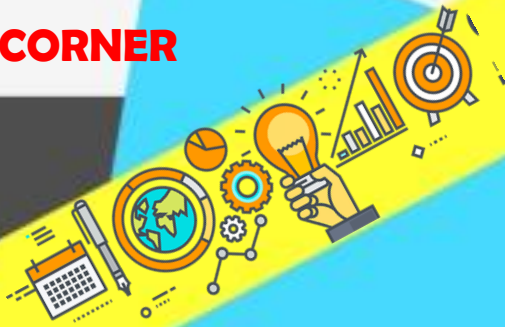

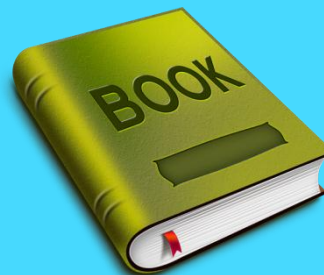

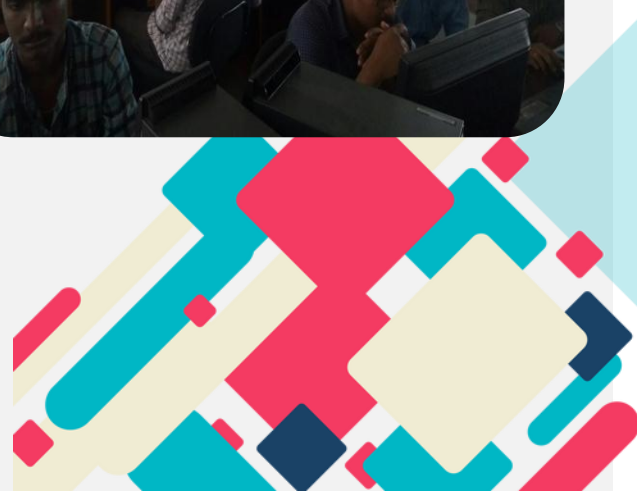

## NEW DESKTOP COMPUTER AND SOME INTERESTING FACTS

The new model introduces a number of new features ; the HDMI port used on previous versions has been replaced by a pair of micro HDMI ports, giving it the ability to output to two external 4K monitors at 60 fps. This more demanding visual output is supported by more powerful components , including a 1.5 GHz Broadcam BCM2837 quad-core SOC.

This is paired with up to 4GB of RAM, and for the first time in Raspberry Pi history, customers will have multiple RAM allocations to choose from. The base version comes with 1 GB of RAM, but this can be upgraded to 2GB to 4GB , depending on the power required.

Impressively, the foundation has maintained its signature price-point despite these changes. the 2GB and 4GB versions have an MSRP of \$45 and \$55 respectively, the entry-level 1gb configuration still costs just \$35. The foundation has been steadfast about maintaining this starting price, in order to make sure the product remains as accessible as possible.

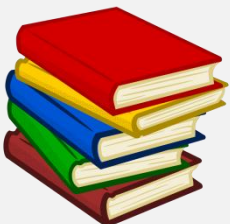
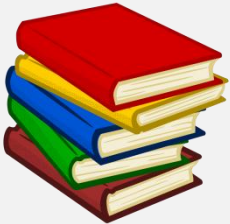
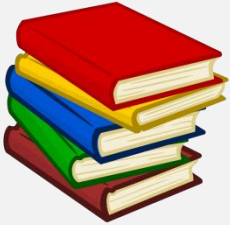

## **The Outsider**

**Stephen King**

An unspeakable crime. A confounding investigation. At a time when the King brand has never been stronger, he has delivered one of his most unsettling and compulsively readable stories.

An eleven-year-old boy's violated corpse is found in a town park. Eyewitnesses and fingerprints point unmistakably to one of Flint City's most popular citizens. He is Terry Maitland, Little League coach, English teacher, husband, and father of two girls. Detective Ralph Anderson, whose son Maitland once coached, orders a quick and very public arrest. Maitland has an alibi, but Anderson and the district attorney soon add DNA evidence to go with the fingerprints and witnesses. Their case seems ironclad.

As the investigation expands and horrifying answers begin to emerge, King's propulsive story kicks into high gear, generating strong tension and almost unbearable suspense. Terry Maitland seems like a nice guy, but is he wearing another face? When the answer comes, it will shock you as only Stephen King can
