CYBER THREAT:

Did you Know cyberThreat19 will be taking place on 25th-26th November in London? The two-day conference is hosted by the UK's National Cyber Security Centre(NCSC) & SANS Institute and takes place at Riverbank Park Plaza, London Riverbank.

This event combines Keynotes from world-renowed experts, CTF/Hackathon challenges and insights.

CyberThreat 2019 evidences the UK Government's commitment to equip practitioners with the skills and Knowledge required to defend against cyber threats and also addresses the cyber skills gap, by developing and growing talent. CyberThreat aims to deliver the best technical conference in Europe for cyber security practitioners.

In addition to presentations from world-renowed cyber security experts and rising industry stars, CyberThreat 2019 features many hands-on opportunities for delegates in the form of CTF events, team problem solving and "Hackathon" challenges against some of the latest devices and products.

Researchers have discovered a vulnerability in Microsoft Excel, on eof the most widely used productivity programs in the corporate world, that could let attackers take over a user's system and remotely launch malware.

The flaw, found by the team at Mimecast, lies in the Power Query tool, which lets users integrate spreadsheets with external databases, text documents and Web pages. If exploited by attackers, it can also launch sophisticated, hard-to-detect attacks. "Using Power Query, attackers could embed malicious content in a seperate data source, and then load the content into the spreadsheet when it ui opened," the company said. The malicious code could be used to drop and execute malware that can compromise the user's machine." Microsoft has not issued a fix for the vulnerability at this time, but did release an advisory document for users, offering a workaround to beef up security. The vulnerability is based upon a method called Dynamic Data Exchange(DDE).

Attacks using this method are common, but this one is notable because it gives intruders administrative privileges. "Because Power Query is a powerful tool within Microsoft Excel, the potential threat for abusing the feature is great", said Mimecast. "Using the potential weakness in Power Query, attackers could potentially embed any malicious payload that as designed won't be saved inside the document itself but downloaded from the web when the document is opened".


