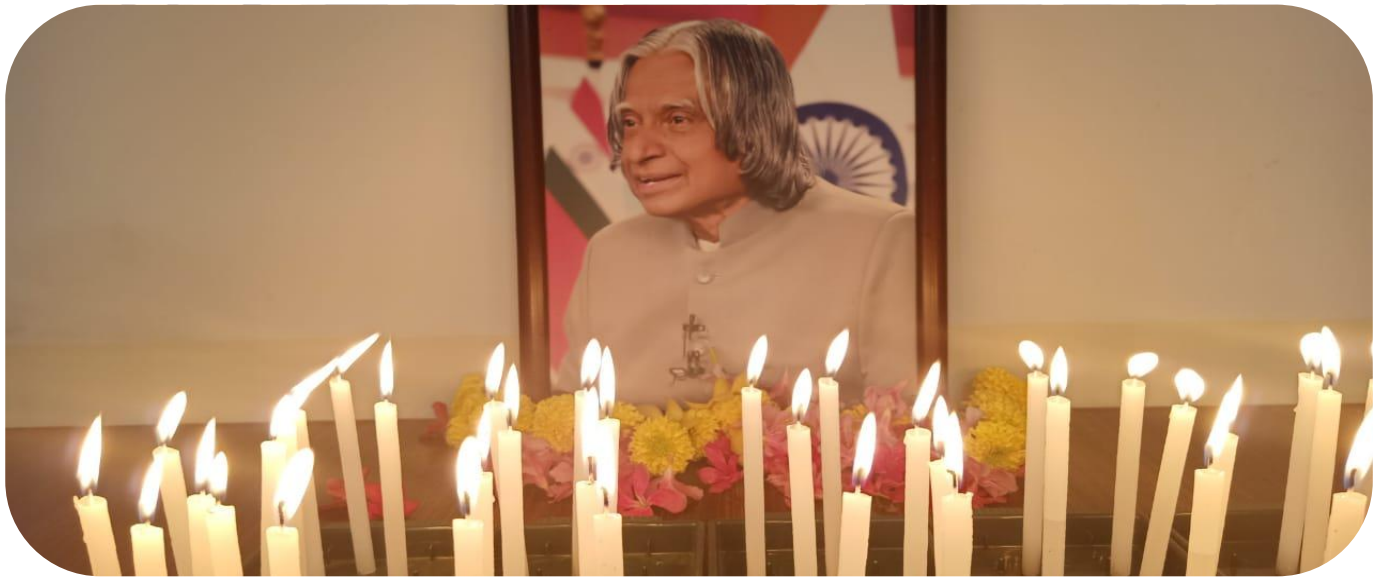

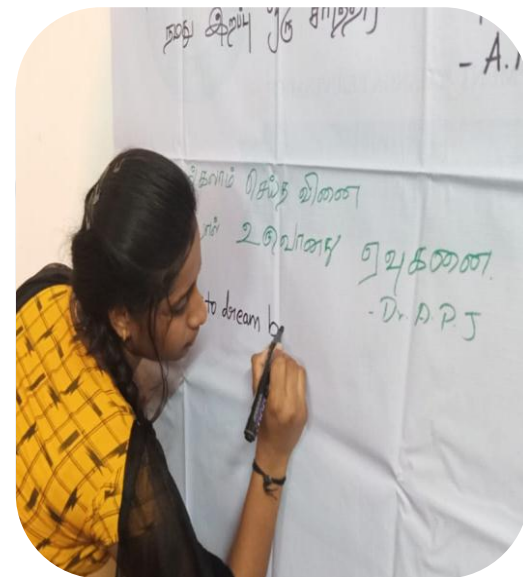

The skills gap is actually an information gap. The problem is not that workers are unskilled; it's that workers don't know what skills employers need. Technology is already disrupting existing jobs, and creating new jobs that never existed before. In fact, the top 10 in-demand jobs in 2010 did not even exist in 2004. Change is happening so rapidly that 65 percent of today's grade school kids in the U.S. will end up at jobs that haven't even been invented yet.

HEALTH TIPS

Drink beetroot juice daily for a healthy liver

The health of every body part is important. The liver is one of the most important organs of your body. It is the most functioning organ compared to the rest of the body. It allows reaching the rest of the body only after removing the toxic from your blood and purifying it. It is the liver that decides whether it is right for your body and keeps filtering the dirt accordingly. In this context, you should take special care of your liver and pay attention to your diet. Beetroot is a very useful fruit, in this case, it helps a lot in stimulating the liver which is sluggish due to excess workload and also calms the excess heat of this organ. Beetroot helps a lot in clearing the blood, which increases liver function.

BOOK REVIEW


The Sea, The Sea

Iris Murdoch

Charles Arrowby, leading light of England's theatrical set, retires from glittering London to an isolated home by the sea. He plans to write a memoir about his great love affair with Clement Makin, his mentor both professionally and personally, and to amuse himself with Lizzie, an actress he has strung along for many years. None of his plans work out, and his memoir evolves into a riveting chronicle of the strange events and unexpected visitors--some real, some spectral--that disrupt his world and shake his oversized ego to its very core.

In exposing the jumble of motivations that drive Arrowby and the other characters, Iris Murdoch lays bare "the truth of untruth"--the human vanity, jealousy, and lack of compassion behind the disguises they present to the world. Played out against a vividly rendered landscape and filled with allusions to myth and magic, Charles's confrontation with the tidal rips of love and forgiveness is one of Murdoch's most moving and powerful novels.
