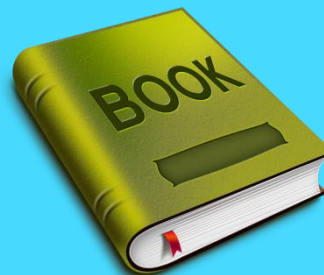

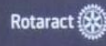

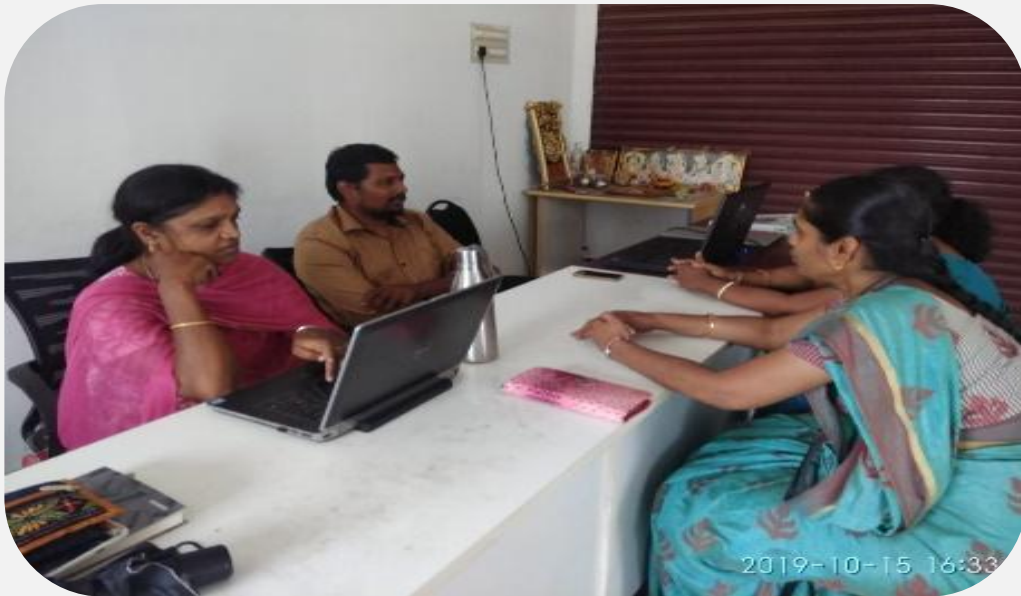

HEALTH TIPS

Adopt these tips to avoid any kind of allergy, read the details

There can be many types of allergies. Many people believe that seasonal allergies begin to end with the onset of cold. But this fact is wrong. Cold does not mean that the environment will be free from allergies. Some unwanted allergies that occur during the cold have been reported. It is important to understand this type of particular allergy.

Dandruff

Domesticated animals such as cats, dogs and birds develop dandruff during winter. Due to the cold, people mostly stay indoors with these animals. Dandruff in animals causes allergic symptoms.

Suggestion - Keep animals out of your bedroom, if possible, keep them in an area that is used less. Also take a bath once a week.

Smoke and pollution

Some people try to keep the house warm by burning wood and chimneys in the cold. The harmful smoke emitted from it contaminates the home environment. This smoke increases the risk of asthma symptoms.

Suggestion- If you burn any wood in the house, make sure that it is completely clean. Before lighting a fire, it is important to keep that part of the chimney open so that smoke can come out.

Dust and particles

Symptoms of Microscopic Allergies- These allergies are caused by dust blowing from beds, mattresses, carpets and furniture.

Suggestion - Put a dust proof cover on the mattress, box springs and pillows. Wash the cover regularly with warm water to eliminate dust particles. Use the vacuum once a week on the carpet.

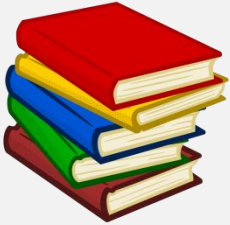

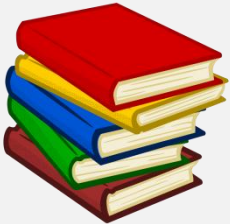
BOOK REVIEW



The Outsider

Stephen King

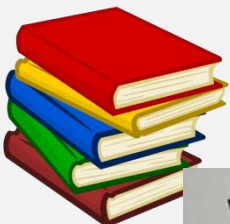
An unspeakable crime. A confounding investigation. At a time when the King brand has never been stronger, he has delivered one of his most unsettling and compulsively readable stories.



An eleven-year-old boy's violated corpse is found in a town park. Eyewitnesses and fingerprints point unmistakably to one of Flint City's most popular citizens. He is Terry Maitland, Little League coach, English teacher, husband, and father of two girls. Detective Ralph Anderson, whose son Maitland once coached, orders a quick and very public arrest. Maitland has an alibi, but Anderson and the district attorney soon add DNA evidence to go with the fingerprints and witnesses. Their case seems ironclad.



As the investigation expands and horrifying answers begin to emerge, King's propulsive story kicks into high gear, generating strong tension and almost unbearable suspense. Terry Maitland seems like a nice guy, but is he wearing another face? When the answer comes, it will shock you as only Stephen King can
